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CHAPTER 1 Introduction

From the CEO's desk

The year 2016 was full of fun, opportunities, challenges and progress at Patang. In continuation with the earlier programmes, new interventions with diverse thematic areas were designed and implemented with enthusiasm. However, two interventions on building capacity of youth and addressing child rights, and improving learning outcome of elementary children had a formal project closure. Notwithstanding, many people supported the programmes financially for the continuation of the work. We explored and developed partnerships that will have a lasting and positive impact for a better youth-led society.

Young people are being highly affected by the most persistent problems, yet are frequently overlooked as part of the solution. Development of youth is of our central focus area and the "Pathmakers programme" is specially designed for this. Our mission is to place young people at the forefront of change and development and to facilitate youth development processes and youth-led social actions in the eastern region of the country as a Regional Youth Support Centre.

In the "Kasturi" programme, we have developed resources and capacitated adolescent girls and young people on gender and sexual and reproductive health and rights.

While keeping the focus on our core work with young people, this year we took steps towards developing young entrepreneurs. Young people have taken up productive livelihoods and employment opportunities that will contribute to increase their household income as well as to the economic development of community through our intervention "Sustain Youth work: Livelihood as a strategy for youth engagement". As part of this programme, we have focused on several in-depth research projects and developed a strong monitoring and evaluation framework to build their confidence and capability.

"Vidya Utkarsh" and "Multi Lingual Education" interventions were the new initiatives which took us closer to realising our vision of ensuring that all children, irrespective of their background, receive quality education which will enable them to reach their potential and transform themselves and their communities.

We have been developing staff capacity both in-house and outside through training, workshops, exposure visits, etc. Patang has established a culture of learning that carries on a tradition of continuous efforts to improve our work, deepen our impact, and widen our reach.

Patang is grateful for the generous support received from a range of donors, partners, stakeholders and trustees. Working together, we can make a change for a better society. My thanks go to all those who make our work possible. With stronger partnerships and their support, I am sure we will continue to move towards achieving our vision of a society where young people take initiative for positive social change.

Thank you to everyone who is helping to turn our vision into a reality.

CHAPTER 2 Programmes

Pathmakers

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

The Pathmakers programme aims at developing leadership among young people through volunteerism. This is a year long volunteering programme meant for college-going students between 18-25 years. The main objectives are to create an alternative learning process to develop the students' understanding about social and economical issues, recognise their potential and develop their skills to decide on their own actions. The programme takes the volunteer through a journey from isolation to participation.

This year we have worked with 13 colleges in the three districts of Sambalpur, Balangir and Bargarh and created opportunities for young people to learn more about social issues through field visits, camps, meetings and workshops. Moreover, the volunteers had the opportunity to work with an NGO for a month. This year, we have placed 12 volunteers in various organisations in different parts of the country.

IMPACT OF THE PROGRAMME

- Thanks to the workshops, events and exposure visits, volunteers became increasingly aware of social issues like road safety, corruption, dependence on alcohol and tobacco, gender inequality and environment pollution.
- Activities facilitated by the volunteers, such as street plays and awareness campaigns, have been covered in the local print media. This has boosted their confidence and encouraged parents to recognise their children's leadership skills.
- Patang has developed stronger ties with different government departments such as the Vigilance Department, the Pollution Control Board, the District Social Welfare Office and the Police Department.

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

From our experience in working with young people, we have observed several challenges related to gender equality and SRHR (sexual and reproductive health and rights). These are mainly due to lack of accessibility to scientific information and to the absence of non-judgmental spaces to freely discuss on these topics. The three goals of the programme are: to create a safe and empowering space for young people, to build young people's capacity to address gender and SRHR issues, and to facilitate the access to information and services on these issues by supporting volunteers in the community.

The Kasturi programme is structured around five components:

MAKING CHANGE MAKERS

A programme aiming at building leadership for social change among adolescents by providing them with skills necessary to play an active role in the society.

CERTIFICATE COURSE IN YOUTH FACILITATION

Special attention is given to gender and SRHR topics and to the enhancement of design, facilitation and leadership skills.

ANUBHAV SHIKSHA Kendra (ASK)

A youth-led space aiming at involving people from the community and facilitating discussions to build awareness for social change.

COMMUNITY GENDER RESOURCE CENTRE

A platform for young people to access material about gender and SRHR, to share and to discuss about these topics.

YUVA SARATHI

A volunteering programme where young people are given an opportunity to act and innovate in their community for social change.

IMPACT OF THE PROGRAMME

- Developed capacities of young volunteers on gender & SRHR issues and take leadership in awareness campaign, contribute in other programme.

Juba Sathi

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

Juba Sathi is a programme developed in partnership with Actionaid and the Sambalpur district administration to strengthen the leadership and participation of young people in community development. We are working with marginalised communities and young people from 48 hamlets from 7 revenue villages of the Meghapal and Chhamunda panchayats. In both areas, tribal communities represent around 80% of the total population.

This year, the Juba Sathi programme has focused on five pillars:

- Orientation of community youth facilitators on government schemes and programmes
- Campaign on accessibility of government schemes and programmes
- Campaign to improve the livelihood of beedi workers (especially women)
- Campaign for land rights
- Follow-up action led by community facilitators





The story of Mandesta Dang

Mandesta Dang is a 35 yearold mother of two girls from the village of Meghapal, in the Sambalpur district. Her childhood dream was to open a tailoring centre but, due to social and economic obstacles, she was never able to fulfil her ambition. When she first met the Juba Sathi volunteers, Mandesta was very demotivated as several organisations before had promised to bring about development in the panchayat but failed to do so. However, thanks to the help of the Juba Sathi volunteers, she was able to obtain a loan from a local bank to open her own tailoring workshop. Today, she is not only earning a livelihood for herself, but she is also imparting tailoring classes to twelve women from the community.

IMPACT OF THE PROGRAMME

- Developed ownership among young people towards their village.
- Increased participation in Gram Sabha and Palli Sabha.
- Reduced migration of young people thanks to their engagement in government livelihood schemes such as MGNREGA and skills development programmes.



- Addressed village issues with community people such as old age pension and Indra Awas Yojana and village development.
- Active participation of young people to the monthly School Management Committee meetings.
- People are now able to access government schemes after receiving land patta.

Squirrel

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

With the support of Child Rights and You (CRY), the Squirrel programme provides opportunities for rural youth and college-going students (18-25 years) to initiate and engage in child rights projects for a period of 8 months. The volunteers are responsible for designing and implementing projects on issues related to education, children protection, health and nutrition in the Sambalpur district.

provided free health check-up in partnership with the Indian Red Cross Society This year, we have noticed significant improvements at children, community and local government levels. Few research projects were also conducted as part of the Squirrel programme:

- Study on health indicators in the villages of the Tikarapada panchayat (Boudh district).
- Health monitoring of children and pregnant and lactating mothers at Anganwadi centres in collaboration with the Jaanch and Matru Committee members.
- Study on reservation in private schools as per RTE Act in the Dhankauda and Jujomura blocks.

IMPACT OF THE PROGRAMME



CHILDREN AND YOUTH LEVEL

Higher participation of the children in the activities organised by the Squirrel volunteers, to the School Management Committees and Panchayat-level Child Protection Committee meetings. Volunteers have demonstrated leadership in addressing RTE and child rights issues in their community and influenced other young people too.



COMMUNITY LEVEL

Increased interest in the communities we work with to highlight and address RTE and health-related issues. Moreover, thanks to the support of the Squirrel volunteers, community people are now taking the initiative to address health-related issues in their villages.



LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND INSTITUTIONS LEVEL

Stronger ties between the Squirrel volunteers and PRI members, government officials (for example, ward members and sarpanches), teachers and anganwadi workers.



Supplementary Education

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

Supported by RDTT, this programme has the objective of improving the learning levels among elementary school-going children and enhancing the quality of education delivered in schools. The target is school children between the age of 9 and 14 years from rural government-run educational institutions in 15 villages of the Balangir district.

This year was full of excitement and learning opportunities for the children, the teachers and us. We have observed that the teachers have started implementing new educational methods and making the learning process more interactive. The children were very receptive to these new methods and to our curricular and co-curricular activities, and this reflected in a remarkable improvement in the children's learning levels.

IMPACT OF THE PROGRAMME

- Dramatic improvement in children's academic performance.
- Strengthened relationship with the education department (District Education Officer, Block Education Officers and CRC Coordinator).
- Campaigned for the implementation of the Ujjwal programme by the Odisha government to enhance quality education.
- Strengthened existing educational spaces such as school libraries and learning centres.



Vidya Utkarsh

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

Vidya Utkarsh was a pilot programme launched in 2016 in five schools of the Bargarh district, with the support of ACC, Bargarh Cement Works. During our field visits and interactions with the stakeholders, we have observed the following problems:

- Gaps in student-teacher ratio
- Irregularity and low levels in students' attendance
- Non-age appropriate learning levels
- Unavailability of learning space for children
- Poor schools infrastructures
- Inactivity of School Management Committees
- Alcohol and tobacco addiction

Given the above observations, Patang has implemented the Vidya Utkarsh programme with the goal of to improve school-going children learning levels through curricular and co-curricular activities and to improve the quality of education delivered in schools. In order to measure the impact of the programme, we have conducted two baseline tests on more that 400 children, one before the intervention and one after. Below are the results.

IMPACT OF THE PROGRAMME

- Drastic improvement of learning levels in target schools.
- Strengthened ties with all stakeholders, including teachers, District project Coordinator, District Education officer, Cluster Resource Centre Coordinator, Block Education Officer, School Management Committee and the local community.
- Improved teaching-learning process through the use of activity-based learning, design and use of teaching and learning material.

Multilingual Education

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

As per the Population Census 2011 data, schedule tribes constitute the 34.1% of the total population in Sambalpur district. The incidence of education failure and dropout among tribal children is higher compared to other categories (up to 80% of tribal children are out of school by class X). The causes behind poor scholastic performance are numerous; however, several studies have shown how the language barrier should be held as a major factor in their academic failure. Keeping this in mind, Patang has launched a programme to improve learning outcomes of elementary school children through mother tongue-based multilingual education (MLE). The first year objectives are the following:



2. Create awareness about MLE and its impact on academic achievements

Engagement with the local community, schools administration and children.

1. Create an MLE team and build its capacity

- Access MLE-related resources and adapting them to the local context.
- Attend/organise training sessions and workshops.
- Develop partnerships.



Youth Development and Livelihood

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

In the past 14 years, Patang has emerged as a Regional Youth Support Centre in Eastern India. Over the years, we have worked with more than 20,000 young people from diverse backgrounds, built capacity in different life skills and spread awareness about social issues. However, we have observed that we neglected a crucial aspect: Creating livelihood and entrepreneurship opportunities for young people. The Youth Development and Livelihood programme was designed to sustain youth work by creating livelihood opportunities and to build a model for youth entrepreneurship in Western Odisha.

This year we have conducted activities in the framework of the three short-term objectives of the programme:

DEVELOP CAPACITY OF TEAM TO WORK ON THE THEMATIC AREA OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND LIVELIHOOD

Exposure visits to model livelihood projects and good practices documentation.





CONDUCT STUDY TO EXPLORE ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND LIVELIHOOD OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE IN LOCAL AREA

Focus areas: Agriculture and allied activities, employability, art and crafts, forest produce, entrepreneurship and wage employment.

PREPARE A CARRY FORWARD PLAN ON YOUTH LIVELIHOOD AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAMME

Focus areas: Organic farming, restaurant industry, sale of organic produce in urban areas and tailoring.



CHAPTER 3 Building Ties

Partnerships



PARTNERSHIP WITH THE LOCAL ADMINISTRATION

During last fiscal, Patang continued to collaborate with various departments of local government and several public bodies. Some of the institutions who supported us in implementing our programmes are: Education, Health, Veterinary, Agriculture and Horticulture Departments, District Labour Office, District Rural Development Agency (DRDA) and District Social Welfare Office (DSWO).

CAPACITY BUILDING OF COMMUNITY-BASED ORG. AND NGOS

Even this year, Patang has carried forward its tradition of cooperation and capacity building of community-based organisations and NGOs. Some of the activities facilitated were:

- Exposure visit on Patang's programmes for the members of the NGO Yuva (Jharkhand) and Rupantaran Foundation (West Bengal).
- 'Gender and its integration with finance literacy' for the members of the NGO ACCION (Bangalore).
- One-day event titled 'Yuva Focus: Centre-Staging Youth Work' with the participation of civil society organisations, representatives of the local administration and funding agencies from Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and West Bengal.

CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

This year, for the first time, Patang implemented a pilot programme as part of the corporate social responsibility efforts of Bargah Cement Works (BCW), a unit of ACC Cement Ltd. Thanks to the support of BCW we were able to reach out to more than 350 children with our Vidya Utkarsh pilot programme.



Centre-Staging Youth Work

The Regional Youth Support Centre at Patang, with the support of the National Foundation for India (NFI), organised a state-level meet of civil society organisations and other stakeholders working toward youth developments.

The event, named "Yuva Focus: Centre-Staging Youth Work", aimed to create an opportunity for various stakeholders on youth issues, from across Odisha extending to Eastern India, to come together, understand each other's work and explore collaborative possibilities. The event showcased youth work case studies and proposed itself as a platform to build solidarity and provide a push for investments in holistic youth development.

The event saw participation of representatives from 40 organisations including civil society organisations, government bodies like NYKS and NSS, as well as institutional support agencies, CSR organisations and media from Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and West Bengal. In total, 160 participants attended the event.

CELEBRATING YOUTH-LED SOCIAL ACTION

The Yuva Focus event was also an opportunity to felicitate and publicly recognise the efforts of 34 dynamic young volunteers who had been part of various processes and programmes of Patang, leading change in their own lives and communities. The Siddharth Memorial Trophy, instituted in memory of late Mr. Siddharth, for his dedication and contribution as a volunteer and co-founder of Patang, was presented to Mr. Nilamani and his group, for their efforts towards strengthening youth groups, addressing child abuse cases, ensuring participation of children and young people in democratic spaces.
